Year 2	<p><b>Significant People:</b> Need for hygiene and what can happen if handwashing etc is not done Mary Seacole - not all plants and herbs are medicinal</p> <p><b>Great Fire of London:</b> Fire safety and safety in the home in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century</p> <p><b>Explorers:</b> Christopher Columbus - water safety</p>
Year 3	<p><b>Ancient Egypt:</b> Sun safety in hot countries - hats and sun cream</p> <p><b>Ancient Greece:</b> Olympics - warm ups before exercise and healthy, balanced diets</p>
Year 4	<p><b>Romans:</b> Safety and hazard awareness on Roman sites e.g. Verulamium</p> <p><b>Vikings:</b> Sea safety</p>
Year 5	<p><b>Victorians:</b> Industrial Revolution - increase in pollution and the long term effect on the environment and people's health.</p> <p><b>Ernest Shackleton:</b> Water safety and keeping warm in extreme weather</p>
Year 6	<p><b>World War 2:</b> Do not try on original gas masks due to asbestos within mask The power of propoganda in the rise of Hitler and how this is still used today via Social Media - "influencers"</p> <p><b>Local Study</b> Stevenage - road safety when travelling around the town.</p>

<b>Year group</b>	<b>Equality &amp; Diversity Elements taught</b>
<p>EYFS</p>	<p>Family life - be aware of different family structures</p>
<p>Year 1</p>	<p>Amelia Earhart First woman to fly solo across Atlantic. People thought women should not do this</p>
<p>Year 2</p>	<p><b>Significant and Inspirational People</b> Mary Seacole had different experiences due to her colour Emily Davidson - rights for women Rosa Parks - civil rights for African-Americans</p>
<p>Year 3</p>	<p><b>Ancient Greece</b> Women in Ancient Greece were expected to stay away from public spaces, girls educated at home, often married in early teens, couldn't vote, own property Spartan women had more rights than those in Athens. Olympics - only men took part; Paralympics</p>
<p>Year 4</p>	<p><b>Romans</b> Unfair treatment of Boudicca when she rebelled <b>Nelson Mandela &amp; Apartheid</b> Black people had no rights to say how the country was run; white people took land from black people</p>
<p>Year 5</p>	<p><b>Victorians</b> Only children from rich families went to school; many children worked from age 5 <b>Civil Rights Movement</b> Racial discrimination made illegal in the US.</p>
<p>Year 6</p>	<p><b>World War 2</b> Women were not allowed in the army, navy and air force - housewives or 'women's jobs' Holocaust - anti-Semitism</p>
