## Music Curriculum



At Lodge Farm we want all children to gain a firm understanding of what music is through listening, singing, playing, evaluating, analysing, and composing across a wide variety of historical periods, styles, traditions, and musical genres. We seek to develop enjoyment and a curiosity for the subject, as well as an understanding and acceptance of the importance of all types of music, and an unbiased respect for the role that music may wish to be expressed in any person's life. We are committed to ensuring children understand the value and importance of music in the wider community, and are able to use their musical skills, knowledge, and experiences to involve themselves in music, in a variety of different contexts. Where possible, we use the extensive resources art the neighbouring music centre to enhance our curriculum.

## **EYFS**

Throughout EYFS interests are observed and learning is facilitated through this. Adults will provide and promote musical learning opportunities in engaging ways for children to:

- be able to sing a few familiar songs.
- imitate movement in response to music.
- tap out simple repeated rhythms.
- explore and learn how sounds can be changed.
- develop a preference for forms of expression.
- notice what adults do, imitating what is observed and then doing it spontaneously when the adult is not there.
- sing to self and make up simple songs.
- make up rhythms.
- capture experiences and responses with music
- begin to build a repertoire of songs and dances.

- explore the different sounds of instruments.
- represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through music

This serves as a solid musical foundation to the rest of the music curriculum as children progress through the school.
