Kristupas had belt grading on Saturday and has achieved a yellow belt! He wants to share this achievement with all his friends as well as inspire others.

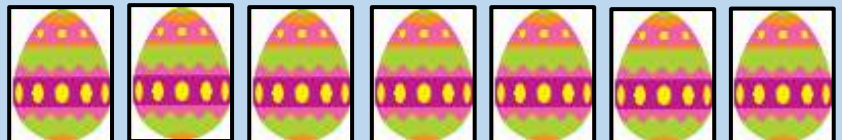
